## **New Brunswick High School Graduation Requirements**

Students can earn a New Brunswick High School Diploma if they have not already graduated from High School in their home country. Length of program will be determined by the number of eligible / transferrable credits from the student's current school and the student's proficiency in the English Language.

### **In order to graduate, you must meet all of the following requirements:**

- Pass 17 out of 20 credits in Grades 11-12, seven of which are compulsory courses listed below
- **Five** of these credits must be from Grade 12 courses including English
- Pass the English Language Proficiency Assessment

### **Compulsory (must select and pass) courses**

- English 11 (**full-year course, 2 credits**)
- Financial and Workplace Mathematics 11 **OR** Foundations of Mathematics 11 (**1credit**)
- Science (**1 credit**) from any of the following: Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Introduction to Environmental Science, Robotics & Automated Technology, Automotive Electrical Systems, Introduction to Electronics, Physical Geography, Human Physiology
- Modern History 11 (**1 credit**)
- Fine Arts & Life Role Development (**1 credit**) from any of the following: Visual Arts, Individual & Family Dynamics, Reading Tutor, Music, Physical Education Leadership, Theatre Arts, Entrepreneurship, Graphic Art & Design, Outdoor Pursuits, Career Exploration, Co-operative Education, Wellness Phys Ed, Nutrition
- English 12 (**1 credit**)

Note: Students take five courses per semester. There are 90 credit hours per course per semester.



## **How to Apply for the Program?**

- 1) Learn more about the NBISP program from CTM Overseas Education Centre.
- 2) Complete the preliminary application form and return it with applicant's last 3 years school report. Applicants can also provide us with certificates received from extra-curricular activities, HKDSE and TOEFL test score, if available.
- 3) Applicants are required to sit for the English test to determine their level of English for the NBISP program. Applicants will be notified on his/her result on the same day after the test. Testing fee is HK\$1,200 and should be paid on or before the test date.
- 4) Applicants will have to complete the official application form and return it with the application fee CAD800.
- 5) Official program acceptance will be issued to qualified applicants. Program fee and medical insurance will be collected from applicants once acceptance is issued by NBISP.
- 6) Applicants will be informed about their assigned school and the host family. Detail information will be provided.
- 7) Official visa documents will be sent to applicants who have made payment of the program fee in full.

### **Package fees include:**

Placement assistance, application assistance, school tuition, orientation, homestay accommodation, full board meals (3 meals daily), roundtrip airport transfers (Arrival & Departure), custodianship, coordinator service, regular communication + 2 personal visits per semester, reports following each visit, 24-hour emergency assistance service



## **Refund Policy:**

- 1) CTM registration and testing fee are non-refundable.
- 2) Program application fee is non-refundable.
- 3) Request for refund must be submitted in writing.
- 4) Request for refund will be considered only if submitted before September 20 for the current school year.
- 5) Refunds are issued only if the international student:
  - a) is not able to obtain a study permit (90% of the program fee refund) \*\*To obtain a refund, student must submit (i) copy of official application form for student visa (ii) copy of Canadian embassy letter of rejection, (iii) copy of receipt.
  - b) withdraws 3 months prior to the beginning of the program (80% of the program fee refund)
  - c) withdraws 2 months prior to the beginning of the program (70% of the program fee refund)
  - d) withdraws within 2 months prior to the beginning of the program (60% of the program fee refund)
  - e) withdraws within one month of the beginning of class (50% of the program fee refund)
- 6) No refund of any fees charged and paid in case of dismissal from program as a result of unacceptable behavior or a failure to adhere to the terms and conditions of the program.
